
## The President's Message

President Wayne Culp brought the meeting to order at 7:10pm. Present were VP Ray Gauthier, Treasurer Bill Peakes, Secretary Dean Lewis, Board Members Harold Whitmore, Malcolm Dunn, and Stephen Culp as well as Past President Craig Gittings. Member Ed Huff joined the meeting later in the evening

## Old Business:

**501c(3):** Forms and papers have been received from the IRS.

**Healing Waters:** Five applications have been received from Vets for honorary membership

## New Business:

**Boy Scouts:** The Boy Scout Merit badge program, on fly fishing, is March 28 and April 4. This is in conflict with the beginning Fly Fishing program through the Silliman Center. The board suggested we cancel and/or reschedule the Fly Fishing program. Craig was going to check to see if there were any one signed up. Stephen suggested that we set the same weekend, each year, for the Boy Scout program and the Fly Fishing program in such a manner that they do not conflict.

**Video Cable:** Harold will be using computer equipment located at the Fremont Adult School for showing knot tying (BSA) using a web site (Animated knots by Grog) found on the internet. ## Delta Vision Task Force Reorganizes Into Non-Governmental Foundation

Members of the Delta Vision Blue Ribbon Task Force announced today they have formed a non-governmental group called Delta Vision Foundation. The foundation will work to support and advance the set of recommendations and strategies proposed in the task force's Delta Vision Strategic Plan, released in November.

Appointed by Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger in 2006, the task force was charged with creating an independent blueprint for a sustainable Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and a reliable water supply for California.

"Although our official duties concluded at the end of the year, we remain committed to meeting the challenge of securing a reliable water supply for California while protecting the Delta's extraordinary environmental resource," said Phil Isenberg, former chair of Delta Vision. "We're entering the worst drought in 20 years, the iconic salmon fishery was closed last year, and finding a durable solution for the Delta has never been more important."

## Bill Deadline Brings New Proposed Environmental Legislation

Last Friday was the deadline to introduce new bills in the State Legislature. Lawmakers made the most of it but introducing piles of them in the waning hours of the day. Among them are hundreds of bills that affect the environment, on topics as diverse as wildlands preservation, toxic remediation, water quality, and energy development.

The Planning and Conservation League (PCL) is proud to be sponsoring several innovative measures in 2009 to protect California's environment and promote public health. Here's a quick summary:

Senate Bill 565, authored by Senator Pavley and sponsored by PCL, targets the enormous untapped potential of safe recycled water. Using the successful model of AB 939 (Sher), SB 565 directs the State Water Resources Control Board to ensure that California recycles 50% of the water that would otherwise be discharged to the ocean by wastewater facilities by 2030. This measure would result in the development of roughly 2 million acre feet of new water by 2030. That makes SB 565 the largest water development program in California since the State Water Project of the 1960's.

Assembly Bill 1408, authored by Assembly member Paul Krekorian and co-sponsored by PCL and the East Bay Municipal Utilities District, provides a new tool to allow communities to accommodate growth without increase water demand. AB 1408 would institute a water neutral development option that developers and water agencies can voluntarily choose to utilize during the development approval process. The bill would encourage developers to build highly efficient houses, and further encourages developers to fully offset the water demand of the development by taking part in water conservation programs for existing homes and businesses.

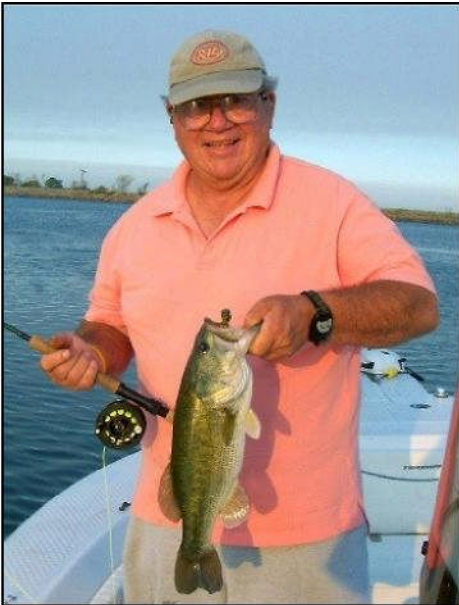
Assembly Bill 499, authored by Assembly member Jerry Hill and sponsored by PCL, is a critical measure relating to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) that will help ensure important legal challenges are not dismissed on a technicality. Currently, confusion over which "real parties in interest" to list when a lawsuit is filed can lead to cases being dismissed before they are heard. AB 499 clarifies that the parties that must be named in a CEQA lawsuit for a particular project are those listed by the lead agency as "recipients of approval" for that project in the agencies' Notice of Exemption (NOE) or Notice of Determination (NOD).

Along with the California Rural Legal Assistance Foundation and others, PCL is co-sponsoring Senate Bill 194 by Assembly member Dean Florez and Assembly Bill 835 by Assembly member Bill Monning. SB 194 asks local jurisdictions to develop and implement a plan to address the existing financial and political barriers that are part of the cause of regional inequity and infrastructure deficits in unincorporated communities throughout the State. AB 835 promotes policies that reduce the use of pesticides with high levels of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and ensures that these toxic chemicals are not substituted for others that are also hazardous to the environment and public health.

## Annual Trout Bum Award

**Starts Jan 1, 2008**

Awarded by MPFA Board of Directors at December board meeting

**Requirements:** *AMPLIFICATION*

**Candidates must:**

**Have fished 10 or more waters during the calendar year (no private pay to play waters)** *This means that the general public have unrestricted access at all times, without any special fees to the waters fished*

**Waters may be tributaries of any river or lakes domestic or international** *Meaning any named stream, river, or section of river (As in Upper Sacramento R. or Lower Sacramento R. - would be two waters) in any country.*

**Used fly fishing tackle only** *Simply that!*

**Have fished for trout (This is a Trout Bum Award)** *Simply that!*  
*The award generally will go to the person who fly fished for trout in the most public waters*

**Have reported to the club and shown photos to the club at a regular meeting**  
*Reporting means informing the membership-simple as that - Does not mean that the person must give a slide show presentation, just tell the club where you fished, how you did, what you used - show some pictures.*  
*The purpose of the award is to encourage members to explore, fish as many new waters as they can, tell the membership about the experience there-fore encouraging others to do likewise.*

MPFA ought to be very proud of Ed & Judy Huff, Malcolm Dunn, Larry Dennis, Dean Lewis & Wayne Culp, why? Cumulatively they have accomplished an amazing effort this year, cumulatively we; We raised \$6,000 (spent most of it) to buy laptop computers, digital projectors & software then....
